Fengious, cultural and social programs that encourage Catholic Faith Renewal, Italian Heritage and Family Unity. In addition, the Federation sponsors higher education scholarship programs; raises funds for seminary scholarships that support future priests; donates money for researching the cure for Cooley's Anemia, a deadly blood disease afflicting people of Mediterranean ancestry; and funds its "Gifts of Love Program," which grants funds to disabled children and adults to foster greater inclusion in our communities and help them advance toward greater independence.
